Necessity, Trust or Stupidity ?

As I write, Rev John and I have to creep into the garage through a different door because the blackbird has built the most ridiculously blatant nest perched on top of a random wood pile. With no camouflage or cover she is sitting on four blue eggs.



Working in the greenhouse has become a very monastic affair as I silently plant up my seedlings whilst a robin, sitting on two eggs, nestles in one of last year's plastic pots on the workbench. Her partner, bobbing around outside, is waiting for me to disappear!

With gratitude to the hawk and owl trust we have been watching the progress of the peregrine



falcon chicks perched high above Norwich on the cathedral spire. The wind howls and the rain lashes in this most exposed position as the parent birds incubate and then feed their young.

Is this necessity, trust or stupidity I ask myself ?

I, as I am sure you do too, continue to be distressed by the migrant situation, in particular the fatalities in the Mediterranean. What must life be like, how bad must life be to put yourself and your children in a flimsy boat or raft, with an untrained captain, made unstable by the hundreds of other people also seeking a place of security, a home in an unknown land.

The Italian rescuers called her 'Francesca', her mother called her 'Gift'. Whilst travelling from Libya to Italy the baby's mother, Stephanie Samuel, endured 8 hours of child bearing labour on one of these awful 10 hour journeys.



Despite the dangers of crossing, it cost her 530 euros in a boat packed with 100 other people, some of whom died.

She was prepared for the risk. "I am not scared" she said, "I make up my mind, and I am not scared



because I believe there is a God". After working in Tripoli for two years the financial situation became so bad she knew that although heavily pregnant she had to escape and leave her husband behind.

Is this necessity, trust or stupidity I ask myself ?

Around the world a great many people live with such insecurity that they have to risk everything so that they may have 'a home', be it a tin shack, a tent or a dwelling of some kind.

The majority of us reading this newspaper however do so in the security of our own homes, having worked hard, sometimes for a lifetime, feathering our own nests as it were. We know comfort and can easily presume that what we have earned is ours to keep.

Not always so! As those who experience sudden and unexpected change, debilitating sickness, financial stress, bereavement or breakdown in relationship will tell you. Suddenly life can become very different as many of those spending the night in shelters or on city streets experience. It could happen to any of us.

Perhaps this begs the question, 'In what or whom do we put our trust, when we have plenty and when we have nothing?'.

Jesus didn't have a home. He took on poverty by choice, as do those who follow Him and live in monastic communities living from necessity, trusting in God, and often being called stupid by the world.

Life is precarious, and whilst it is wise to be responsible for ourselves and those who have been entrusted to us, we cannot take life for granted or have ultimate control. So let us not judge others this day, let us be grateful for what we have and be willing to share our homes with those who may not have one.

Is this necessity, trust or stupidity?



A Welcome Service For Chris Ellis

Rev'd Chris Ellis, whose appointment as Rector of the Thurton Benefice was announced in the April/May edition of Eleven Says, is to be formally installed in his new post at a service in Bergh Apton Church at 7.30pm on the evening of Tuesday 30th June 2015.



There are two phases to this service whose origins lie in the Middle Ages but whose current form is comparatively recent. Chris will be instituted (given the 'cure of souls') by Bishop Alan, Bishop of Thetford, who will then invite the Venerable Stephen Betts, Archdeacon of Norfolk, to induct Chris into 'possession' of the Benefice. In this second phase of the service Chris is, in effect, given church buildings and a home to help in the task given by the Bishop.

This impressive service of Institution and Induction, that includes welcomes by representatives of all the villages in the Benefice, marks the beginning of a new phase of ministry for Chris. A new home and neighbours for Chris and his wife Melanie, and a new chapter in the life of his parishioners in the five villages within the Thurton Benefice.

Thankfully, the seating capacity of Bergh Apton Church, at a little over 200, should accommodate all the invited Clergy and Lay guests involved in the ceremonial and, as well, those of our Church Group who would like to attend. We look forward to seeing those of you who would like to be there.

St Columba – the man who brought Christianity to the UK

June 9th 597 is the anniversary of the death of St Columba who founded the monastery on Iona.

Columba was born in Donegal, Ireland, and entered the monastery of St Finnian as a young man with the name Colum ('the dove'). He spent 15 years preaching and teaching in Ireland and founded a number of monasteries. He was skilled at illuminating Biblical texts and it was alleged that he made a copy of the Psalms from the edition belonging to Finnian.

Columba's model for reaching people has a lot to say to us today. In contrast to our one-to-one evangelism, he used a team approach to reach people in a settlement. He would establish a community by inviting seekers to join, or by bringing them into a community of faith. Within this fellowship, those seeking faith could engage in conversation,

ministry, prayer, and worship. In time, they would be invited to commit their lives to Christ.

This approach is similar to courses like Alpha or Christianity Explored, which have proved very effective today.

Columba died in 597 AD aged 76. He left behind a flourishing network of monasteries giving Iona a central place in the Celtic Church which continues today.

'Be a bright flame before me, O God, a guiding star above me. Be a smooth path below me, a kindly shepherd behind me today, tonight and for ever. Alone with none but you, my God I journey on my way; what need I fear when you are near, O Lord of night and day? More secure am I within your hand than if a multitude did round me stand. Amen.'
(St Columba).

Brenda Anne Hawes, 1941 - 2015

Extracts from tributes at her Service of Thanksgiving held in St Peter's Church, Bramerton.

Brenda made a tremendous contribution to Bramerton. She served on the Parish Council for almost 20 years, being the Chairman for 4 years and Vice-chairman for three periods totalling a further 9 years. Whilst she was in the Chair, Bramerton celebrated the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, the management of the Village Pond was improved to reduce flooding across the Street, the bus shelter was replaced after major damage in a gale, the management of the Site of Special Scientific Interest on the Common was agreed with English Nature (Natural England), and 30 mph speed limits were extended in the village.

Brenda liked Council meetings to finish on time and would do her best to achieve it. She was good at listening and connected well with people, bringing their views and concerns to the Council. At one Parish Council meeting Brenda was very excited to inform the Council that Great Crested Newts had been found in the Recreation Ground Pond, which was typical of her love for nature. She then set out a plan for making the Pond a better environment for newts.

Brenda was also Tree Warden for the whole of the time on the Council and was very proud of her training. She instigated many tree planting initiatives in Bramerton. Trees and hedges were planted on the Common and on the Recreation Ground as well as along certain road verges. Good use was made of saplings provided by South Norfolk Council each November. However planting trees in November can be a dirty business, yet Brenda managed to assemble and play her part in working parties of volunteers.

Brenda also played an important role in the life of St Peter's Church and gave substantial support to her husband, Christopher, the Church Warden. She put her flower arranging skills to good use in the Church and played a leading part in decorating the Church for major festivals. Her interest in the theatre, drama and poetry was channelled not only into her own readings in services but also into poetry events in the Church to bring people together and to raise money for church funds. There have also been raffles at Harvest Lunches, stalls at Coffee Mornings, Christmas cards, which she made and sold for Church funds, and hospitality at Squirrels Drift Bar-B-Q's.

Bramerton has much to remember and thank her for.

Geoff has talked about all that Brenda did for this village, but her generosity of spirit went even further than that: Brenda was a born teacher, it had been her great passion during her working life when she taught at Woodside, Wensum View, Lakenham and Heartsease Middle School, so when Christine Wheeler asked Brenda to teach people how to speak out in church when they were reading the lesson or saying the prayers, Brenda jumped at the chance. I had expected that we would simply be taught how to project our voices in a fairly boring way, but that was to radically underestimate Brenda's talents. She had us all acting the part of the witches in the witches' scene from Macbeth!

Brenda loved drama and for 17 years was schools' liaison officer working with Dick Condon at Norwich Theatre Royal. She also took a leading role in the Bramrocks for many years.

I think Brenda would want to say to us today:

Miss Me, But Let Me Go

When I come to the end of the road,
and the sun has set for me.
I want no tears in a gloom filled-room,
Why cry for a soul set free?
Miss me a little, but not too much
and not with your head bowed low.
Remember the love that we once shared,
Miss me, but let me go.

For this is a journey we all must take
and each must go alone;
It is all part of God's perfect plan
A step on the road to home.
When you are lonely and sick of heart
go to the friends that we know
and bury your sorrows in doing good
Miss me, but let me go.

Hellington and Rockland St Mary Community Reserve

Spring has well and truly arrived on the Reserve. We saw the first orchid leaves on 2nd May; the hedge has sprung into leaf; we heard the first cuckoo two weeks earlier and identified much flora and fauna to expand the survey started in March.

We have received a positive survey report from Norfolk Wildlife Trust. The area that was surveyed is of considerable wildlife interest, meeting the selection criteria for County Wildlife Sites in Norfolk, and it has therefore been added to the CWS register. This recognises the area as being among the best remaining wildlife areas in Norfolk, outside of legally protected sites. Currently a management plan is being compiled with the support of an Easton College Student.

A permanent bridge, sign boards and compost toilet are to be installed this spring and we look forward to picnics, surveys and yoga on the reserve. However, we will need help to remove ragwort and to keep the paths cut.

In April a drawing event was held and a willow weaving workshop led by Jane Frost produced good basketwork and a screen for the Reserve that acts as a landmark or meeting place.

Rockland Broad Drama

Four people were rescued from a sinking rowing boat on Rockland Broad one afternoon in April.



The boat got into difficulties in the shallow part of the broad. Apparently it hit an underwater stake that made a hole in the 60 year old timber boat and the passengers ended up in muddy water that came up to their waists.

The incident could have been much more serious if a Broad's Authority boat had not come quickly to their rescue. Broad's Authority Ranger Edgar Hoddy pulled the family to safety and managed to save most of their belongings. The family was shaken but unharmed. Only two of the four people were wearing life jackets and if help had not come quickly who knows what might have happened. The incident shows the importance of wearing life jackets at all times on water and to stay within the marked channels. The family have now bought more life jackets.

The fire brigade attended the scene and were ferried out to the drama in the good ship BLOT.

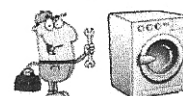
