Welcome

Welcome to the December edition of the Norfolk Rural Communities Newsletter (previously the Op Randall newsletter).

We have held four rural engagement evenings in the last month which have been very popular with over 160 people attending; these events will continue in the new year.

These and similar events are just one way we are seeking to listen to your needs and work in partnership with you to address the issues that are most important to you. They also provide an opportunity for us to update you on our activity and for you to ask questions and hold us to account.

We continue to carry out rural patrols engaging with community members, farmers, land workers, rural business and representative bodies. If you or

your local community group would like to host a rural engagement evening we would be delighted to accommodate you, all you need to do is make contact with PC Dave Armstrong whose details are on page 4 of this newsletter and we will seek to make it happen.

Norfolk Constabulary and it's rural policing team along with partner agencies took part in the National Rural Day of Action last month which saw two arrests for unfit to drive and GBH, two vehicles seized for no insurance, two hare coursing incidents responded to, a number of scrapyards, churches and boatyards visited, three drone deployments in support of ongoing incidents and a range of intelligence gathering and crime prevention activities carried out.


The following Chart shows the number of reported incidents or crimes of -

Hare continues to be a priority for Norfolk Constabulary and in the last month regular and Special Constabulary officers have deployed locally and regionally to tackle this type of criminality.

The number of incidents reported to police has reduced over the past 12 months; however, we remain vigilant and recognise the importance of targeting individuals involved in hare coursing.

Your help and support remains crucial so if you spot any of the following call the

police on 101 or if a crime is taking place 999. Remember, always keep yourself safe.

- Lurches' or similar dogs running loose
- Vehicle registration numbers, make and model if suspect involved in hare coursing
- How many people, dogs, were there, did you see any Hares, were the dogs chasing Hares.

Church Lead Thefts

There has been a recent increase in our rural churches being targeted by criminals for their lead. We are continuing to work with the Diocese to protect these buildings, through various crime prevention methods including alarms and protective marking.

Up until recently this type of crime was only being carried out during the hours of darkness but in recent weeks we have seen a change in the criminal's tactics with reports of men in fluorescent jackets .

Your help and support remains crucial so if you spot anything unusual around or nearby any church please report it. .

Support for Mental health

Living in a rural community can feel lonely and isolated, often enhanced by the fear of crime, either real or imaginary. This can enhance everyday worries and issues and can lead to a decline in mental health. There are charities out there that offer help and guidance, one such charity is YANA (You Are Not Alone).

YANA has successfully raised the profile of mental health, highlighting that it is 'ok not to feel ok'.

Yana is confidential and encourages those suffering from depression, stress or anxiety to visit their GP or contact the YANA helpline. YANA can fund up to 6 sessions of counselling and these can be put into place within days, compared to NHS waiting times of months.



Good News Stories

Four males were arrested for Hare Coursing in the West of the County, initially the males made off from the scene in a vehicle, but were located a short time later. All four males were subsequently arrested.

Following the arrest, officers seized the following, four dogs, the vehicle, three mobile phones and a camcorder, which when viewed was found to show in excess of 20 other Hare Coursing incidents and numerous other persons taking part in them. The investigation continues and we will be working closely with other forces in order to try and identify those involved.

Officers from Operation Randall, using Drones as air support have been assisting local officers in the execution of search warrants, which has led to stolen property being recovered, a Cannabis factory being discovered and seven persons being arrested.
