Message from Inspector Andrew

January has seen another busy month for officers, who have been working extremely hard, achieving some fantastic results which I wanted to highlight. You may have seen in the press that 2 males were recently arrested and charged in relation to 20 burglary offences committed in 2018 and a further offence from January with some of these offences being committed across South Norfolk. It was down to the teamwork of local officers and other units assisting that both males were located and found in possession of stolen items, with officers from the Beat Manager team conducting the investigation and interviews the following day. Another positive result followed a number of recent burglaries at building sites, with a male and female being arrested and also found in possession of stolen items. Again, following some great work by response officers overnight, the Beat Manager team carried out the interviews the next day, changing their shifts so they could assist which again resulted in charges for both suspects, one of whom was remanded overnight.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	4	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	3	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	5	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	6	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	2	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Sansbury

"Although January seemed to go on and on, we accomplished so much! I have been working very hard recently on an investigation that involved 20 sports and social clubs being burgled in the Spring of last year, including in the D14 area. Then last week, two males were arrested on suspicion of breaking into a café in Brooke. They were subsequently charged with Conspiracy to Commit Burglary in regards to both of the above. My hope is that this will significantly reduce crime, and in particular burglaries, on the D14 area, which is one of the top 3 priorities for my Beat.

Colleagues from the Special Constabulary are also eagerly working alongside me in continuing to target the top 5 speeding locations in D14. And I will once again look to raise awareness about road safety throughout the local schools in the coming months.
