Is there room?

In the gospel stories (gospel meaning good news) we read about the birth of the baby Jesus and what happened before and after this momentous time. Now we know this all happened a long time ago, but various writers in the bible are at pains to point out they have investigated the stories and events, partly from a historical perspective. So there is proof that various historical figures existed at the time.

A lady called Elizabeth was married to a priest called Zechariah, but they had no children and were quite old. One day when Zechariah was chosen to burn incense in the Temple, an Angel appeared to him to say he would have a son. Zechariah didn't believe the Angel and was struck dumb, but Elizabeth did become pregnant.

During this time an Angel also appeared to a young girl called Mary to tell her that she too would have a baby. Although Mary was quite young, probably a teenager, and promised in marriage to Joseph, she believed what the Angel told her, even though it must have been quite difficult to cope with.

Moving forward to more recent times, the hymn written by Emily Elliott goes "O come to my heart Lord Jesus, there is room in my heart for thee", so we need to ask ourselves a question.

Is there room in your heart for Jesus? Is there room in mine?

Are our hearts and minds full up with other things so that there is no room for Jesus?

When you look at some of the people around the world making the news, there is a real shortage of wisdom, humility and compassion. It's me, me, me - I want the power and the glory - let the rest of the population go hang. I want what's best for me and if I have to climb in the trough and push others out of the way, then so be it. Without room in our hearts for Jesus, all of us will fall short of God's standards.

The hymn goes on to say "Heaven's arches rang when the angels sang, proclaiming thy royal decree, but in lowly birth didst thou come to earth and in great humility".

Out in the fields near Bethlehem, an Angel appeared to some shepherds to bring them good news. At the birth of Jesus, the Son of God, the overwhelming joy of heaven could not be contained, but burst out as a great army of Angels sang praises to God.

The hymn ends "let thy voice call me home saying, yet there is room, there is room at my side for thee". Would we not be better off knowing there is room for us at the side of Jesus?

May Jesus be the light of your world in 2025.

Thurton Benefice Update

What's on in the Thurton Benefice, December and January

Advent begins on the 1st December and it is a season which, outside of the Church, seems to have been lost in all the busy-ness of the run up to Christmas. The Advent Wreath is the most visible sign of the season in our church buildings, and I am often asked why some churches have 3 purple, 1 pink and 1 white candle whilst others have 4 red candles and 1 white.

Traditionally, if the church uses coloured vestments, the purple/pink (or more accurately rose/white) combination should be used to match the vestments. If coloured vestments are not part of the local church tradition, the red/white combination is more commonly used.

During the lighting of the candles on the four Sundays of Advent, we remember those who were looking forward to the coming of Christ, the Patriarchs (Abraham, Isaac and Jacob), the Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Strictly speaking, the vestment matching candles should be used during Advent and then replaced on Christmas Day with the Red/ White to mark the beginning of the Christmas celebration and lit each week until the end of Epiphanytide.





South Yare Wildlife Group

Biodiversity Project Success

Climate Change is the primary driver of Biodiversity loss. And Climate Change depends on Biodiversity as part of the solution. So clearly the two are linked and cannot be separated.

Elizabeth Mrema - United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity.

Climate Change and the loss of animal and plant species are the greatest threats that our planet face, and although the challenges are immense, it is good to be able to report that we, in the South Yare Wildlife Group, have been actively helping to increase biodiversity. It may be only a small step, but we have been successful in re-introducing a lost species back into Broadland; the Large Marsh Grasshopper!



Mainland Great Britain has 10 species of grasshopper and The Large Marsh Grasshopper (LMG) is by far the largest and most impressive, but although it was once common in Norfolk, its numbers had dwindled until it was restricted to just a few wet bogs in Dorset and the New Forest. Therefore 'Hop for Hope' project was launched (a collaboration between Citizen Zoo, Norfolk Wildlife Trust, Natural England and the SYWG). We enlisted the help of 'citizen keeper' volunteers to help rear the LMGs with the aim of re-introduction to suitable sites in East Anglia, where it had previously existed 50-100 years ago. The LMGs were reared and released successfully in selected sites in East Anglian from 2018. The South Yare Wildlife Group has been involved in the project for the last three years, contributing funding, identifying suitable habitats,

arranging site visits and enlisting the all important 'citizen keepers' to carefully rear the LMG from tiny eggs to full adults, and this year saw the first reintroduction of the LMG to the Broads, at the Ted Ellis Nature Reserve at Wheatfen. The LMGs were released on July 14th and August 18th and although they quickly dispersed into the marshland habitat, they were subsequently spotted living happily in their new environment.



They were part of 1,500 hoppers released across Norfolk this year and it is hoped that the ones released at Wheatfen will have laid eggs that will hatch next year and spread across the Yare Valley marshes.

A big thank you to the Citizen Keepers and all involved in the *Hop of Hope* project. A small but significant step in reversing the loss of Biodiversity.






Framingham Pigot




